### Resource Information Sheet

Based on funding shortages in the Stage 3 child care program, you may be in danger of losing your subsidized child care funding. If that is the case, you may contact any of the resources below for assistance.

1. If your children are between the ages of birth to five, they may be eligible for the Head Start Program. If you believe that this Program could assist you in providing child care services, you can find information at <http://caheadstart.org/HSPprograms.html> or you can call the Resource and Referral Network at 800-543-7793.
2. If you have received CalWORKs cash assistance in any of the previous 24 months, you may be eligible for child care services through the CalWORKs Stage 2 child care program. If this is your situation, please contact your Child Care Eligibility Specialist immediately.
3. You may be eligible for CalWORKs cash assistance if you have limited income. If this is your situation, please contact your County Welfare Department at (866) 262-9881.
4. If you believe that you are in danger of losing your job because of the loss of your child care subsidy, you may be eligible for CalWORKs Diversion through the County Welfare Department. To apply for the Diversion Program, please contact your County Welfare Department at (866) 262-9881. Once you have been determined eligible for the Diversion Program, you may be eligible for CalWORKs Stage 2 child care. The welfare department will assist you in applying for Stage 2 child care benefits.
5. You may also contact your Resource and Referral Agency to get general information and assistance in finding child care services. You may contact the local Resource and Referral at (800) 481-2151 or find information about San Diego County's Resource and Referral Agency at <http://www.rrnetwork.org/resources-and-links/california-map.html>.
6. If your children are school-age, you may be able to find before and after school care. These programs provide after school academic and educational enrichment opportunities for children in grades 1 through 8 (ASES) and grades 1-12 (21st CCLC). Parents should contact their local school district to determine if they have either an ASES or a 21st CCLC Program at the school their child attends, what enrollment and attendance requirements exist and if openings are available.
